

The Elkhart Historical Society's Christmas Candlelight Services scheduled for December 3rd at the Chapel on the Hill were so well received that a Sunday Matinee was added for December 4th. The program was conceived by Sue Rogers, who put together a talented group of musicians, vocalists and presenters filling the historic St. John the Baptist Chapel with fabulous Christmas musical compositions and intriguing stories of the origins of that music.
