Answering present: Kyle Farmer, John Galassi, Matt Fights, Matt Langan, and Travis Moore. Matt Olson was absent. Clerk Mona Maas, Treasurer Amy Roberts, and Attorney Don Behle were present.

STREETS/ALLEYS

Street repairs were completed. Bret Aukamp discussed the drain issues on Kennedy Road. Logan County's portion of the Energy Transition Community Grant can be earmarked to help fund a plan to more effectively drain the water off the ditches. They will be cleaning ditches to try to flow better right now and will be proceeding with more extensive work to get water moving. There will be engineering and planning work done to divert and tie into the existing storm sewer system in Prairie Point. This "ETCG" topic will be on the Meeting Agenda for December, and the public can attend to contribute.

BUILDINGS/VILLAGE PROPERTIES/EQUIPMENT

The Elkhart Historical Society's 35th annual Christmas Candlelight Services will be held on Saturday, December 6, 2025, with services at 2 p.m., 4 p.m., 5:30 p.m., and 8 p.m., and a matinee on Sunday, December 7 at 2 p.m. This cherished tradition welcomes another season of celebrating the Birth of Christ with a new program of script and music set to the theme, "A Classic Christmas." Songs and memorable stories of Christmas will be shared, drawn from an era when simple giving brought true riches, and the timeless values of kindness and goodwill illuminated even the most challenging times.

Guests will enjoy the musical talents and dramatic readings of a gifted cast, all within the warm, candlelit embrace of the historic St. John the Baptist stone chapel atop Elkhart Hill. As dusk falls, a beautiful pathway of luminaria will welcome you, inviting friends and neighbors to gather and usher in the 2025 Christmas season with a program designed to bring "peace on Earth, goodwill to men."

Meals prior to or following services will once again be available. The Talk of the Town will serve the meals on Saturday at an additional cost of \$35. The Elkhart Historical Society will take care of making your reservations. Meals must be prepaid and can be on the same check as your service tickets and membership. The full details are included on the reservation form, allowing you to pick the service time and optional dining times. Reservations are required for everything and can be made by calling 217-947-2238.

Tickets for candlelight services are \$15 each. Your 2026 memberships are \$20 for seniors and \$25 for everyone else.
