

On Friday, September 22, 2023, the Elkhart Historical Society will welcome Carol Pelz and David Davis from the Oglesby Mansion Board in Decatur as our featured speakers for the September Dinner Lecture. They will present "The Other House that Richard Built: Oglesby's Decatur Mansion." The talk will include the history of the house and Oglesby's family, the restoration of the house, Oglesby's place in American history, and the tours and activities that the group offers to the public.

As President of the board, Pelz enjoys sharing her knowledge of the Oglesby and Lincoln history to children as well as adults, many of whom have no idea of the extent of that friendship. Davis, who serves on the property committee, also chairs the "History Comes Alive" committee, and is very involved finding speakers and getting people excited about our Oglesby history, which, as you will discover, goes well beyond "local."

Richard J. Oglesby, born in 1824, orphaned at age 9, was raised by an uncle in Decatur, studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1845. Everything else about Oglesby reads like a novel. He served his country politically in many venues and defended his country in many locations. He had a large family, and he had connections! This event is going to enlighten or refresh your knowledge about the Oglesby/Lincoln era and make you glad that you came, and perhaps happy to be in Illinois!

The event will take place at Horsefeather's Wild Hare Café, 104 Gov. Oglesby St., Elkhart, IL 62634, at a cost of \$45 per person. The entrees are: Crusted Breast of Chicken topped with Alfredo sauce or Pork Medallions in a wine & mushroom sauce. What Makes Elkhart Unique and Special

Richard Latham

Richard Latham was 21 when he and his father first arrived in Elkhart in 1819. Being six years older than the next youngest child, he was treated as a partner and had the responsibility for helping with both building and farming. Benjamin Briggs and his wife soon followed the Latham's from Kentucky and settled at Elkhart Grove, bringing with them Emily Hubbard, the sister of Mrs. Briggs. Within two years, Emily and Richard were married, and theirs was the first marriage to be solemnized in the county. In 1823, Richard and his father James built a horse mill which was ordinary other than it required four horses to give it power. It was probably a fairly simple mill, consisting of little more than a stationary millstone, and one that revolved on top of it, powered by the horses.

Richard and Emily had one child, but tragically in 1825 both Emily and the baby died and were the first two burials in the Latham Cemetery on Elkhart Hill. Richard was remarried in 1828 to Margaret Broadwell, a widow, (whose son William laid out the town of Broadwell). Not much else is known about Richard except that he eventually moved to Springfield where he died on June 5, 1868, and his remains were brought to Latham Cemetery for burial.
