WHAT MAKES ELKHART UNIQUE AND SPECIAL

What's in a Name??

Our wonderful town went by the wrong name for 96 years!! How is that possible??

Our town was incorporated February 22, 1861, by a special act of the General Assembly and named the "Town of Elk Hart City". The Town Board consisted of a president and five trustees holding office for one year. They received no compensation but were "exempt from road labor during the time they are in office". If anyone knows what exactly that means I'd love to know.

Members of the first Board of Trustees were: James Rivne's, president; C. Elwood, A. Downing, B. J. Williams, A. Buzzard, M. Buzzard, and W. M. Helm, appointed clerk. Does anyone know if any of their descendants live in the area now?

In 1885 the Town was incorporated as a Village under the general laws of the state relinquishing the special charter. A petition, signed by 46 people, was presented to the board requesting the incorporation. An election was held on March 26, 1885, with 57 votes for the change and 5 against.

The board reorganized under the name of "Village of Elkhart City". It is assumed this change was never officially recorded. In 1978 the then current president of the Board of Trustees was notified that records show the legal name to still be "Town of Elk Hart City".

A public hearing was held June 26, 1979, to change the name to "Village of Elkhart". An ordinance was passed by the Board July 10, 1979, and approved by the Office of the Secretary of State November 14, 1979.

And so now we have our official name that we've been going by. Welcome to the Village of Elkhart!!

The year's final Dinner Lecture presentation from the Elkhart Historical Society promises to be unique as it will give new insights concerning the creation of some of the most beautiful stone buildings in the Springfield area. "The Culver Chronicles: The Story of Col. Culver and Culver Chronicles", will be presented by Lee Ann Burgener, on Friday October 18, 2024, at



Horsefeathers' Wild Hare Café in Elkhart Illinois. The doors open at 5 p.m. and dinner will be served beginning at 5:30 p.m. The cost is \$45 per person, and reservations are required and can be made by calling 217-947-2238, where you may be prompted to leave your name, phone number and the number of people in your party, which will hold your place in line for seats. You will get a return call confirming your reservation and to answer any questions you may have. The deadline for reservations is October 9, 2024. Our presenter Lee Ann Burgener developed a fascination for investigation while doing an assignment for 8th grade, on her family's genealogy. This fact-finding beginning grew into research on buildings, their history, which in turn expanded into the builder, and his genealogy. Her subject tonight explores the life journey of Col James Culver and his monument company which began in 1871, as The Culver Marble and Granite Works. His brother soon joined him, sharing the workload which allowed him to expand into the construction of buildings, which merged his skill in stonework with the expertise of well-known architects. He became a general contractor in 1887 when he built the Second Methodist Church at 5th and Carpenter. Some of his works include Carnegie Library, Franklin Life Building, Governor Tanner's Monument, Governor Yates' home, Illinois State Military Museum, YMCA, and numerous banks and churches. He also worked on the Old State Capitol and the Governor's Mansion. Culver Construction became a part of American History when they were selected to do the first reconstruction of Abraham Lincoln's Tomb. The rest, as they say, is history. Col. Culver worked on or created over 3000 buildings in Springfield alone, and many more throughout the country, which include, the Illinois Monument at Vicksburg National Military Park, and the St. John the Baptist Chapel ca., 1892 (the Gillett Chapel) in Elkhart Illinois.
