What Makes Elkhart Unique and Special

"The "point" of a Good Education"

Logan County's first school teacher definitely qualifies as unique. Erastus Wright was born January 21, 1779 in Bernardstown, Massachusetts. We know almost nothing of his early family life or education. We do know that Erastus and his brother Charles made their way to Buffalo, NY where they boarded a schooner for Fort Dearborn (now called Chicago), followed the Illinois River down to Fort Clark (now Peoria) and trekked to Elkhart and then to Springfield by November 21,1821.

James Latham (remember Elkhart Grove and the Kentucky House from previous articles) had just been selected as the first Probate Justice of Sangamon County. At this time what we currently know as Logan County was still part of the big Sangamon County and did not become a separate county until 1839. Latham hired Erastus Wright to teach his children at Elkhart Grove during the winter of 1821-22. Robert Latham is quoted in Stringer's "History of Logan County" as saying that Wright would take him on his knee and point out the letters with the blade of a jackknife. If young Latham did not pay close attention, Wright would gently prick him on the forehead with the knife "and thus not only secure attention but impress upon the young pupil's mind a remembrance of the names of the letters of alphabet". Wright returned to Springfield in the spring, where he taught for many years, as well as serving 10 years as Sangamon County School Commissioner. According to historians, Wright is remembered for putting the fear of God into many of his young pupils!

Erastus Wright claimed to have "built the first frame house in what is now the city of Springfield". He had also at one time owned land in Petersburg (at the same time Abraham Lincoln lived in New Salem). He traded 80 acres of land in Schuyler County for an elk which he built a park for in Springfield. He could be seen riding the elk (instead of a horse) or using the elk to pull his buggy or wagon. He was a very staunch abolitionist and good friends with the journalist and newspaper publisher Elijah P. Lovejoy. He married Jane Gardner and they had three children. She died. He married Lucy Barrows and when she died he married Lucy Carpenter. He died in November 1870 when he was struck by a railroad train after stumbling near the Chicago & Alton railroad station in downtown Springfield. He is buried in Oak Ridge Cemetery in Springfield with a tall intricate white marble monument featuring Wright's head on top.

Erastus Wright's time in Elkhart Grove was short, but he is remembered for being the first school teacher in Logan County...and being one of eight pallbearers for Abraham Lincoln's casket at Lincoln's funeral.

- Several of you have offered your help in "hands on" efforts, but don't have the time for committee work-->You will hear from us!


The Elkhart Pollinator Habitat is gearing up for SPRING!

Month-Long Presidential Display

An opportunity to see some TRULY unique historical items!

In 1860, friend and sculptor Leonard Volk created a 'Life Mask' - a mold taken directly of Abraham Lincoln's face - when Lincoln had just won the Presidential election. This bust from that mold also shows something not often seen after that: President Lincoln without a beard.

A second item is something that may never be captured again: a photograph of FIVE US Presidents together at one time (and no one is lying in state). Included in the frame is the signature of each President pictured...not a duplicate of the signature, but a piece of paper personally signed by that President when he was in office.

Additional pieces include:

a letter on White House stationary sent to 'Mrs. Johnson' from President Ford (complete with stamped envelope), a picture of President Lincoln made in the 1930s, and the book, <u>Letters from the Oval Office.</u>
