The one in the center has 42 stars and was made in the **1940s**. Each of these drapes is 12 feet long! (Pssst...they looked even better in person.)

In APRIL we begin to partner with the Elkhart Library! We will have free flower SEED at the library; STOP IN, see our April seed display and take-home seeds for Sunflowers, annual and perennial mixed flowers along with instruction.

On Saturday, April 30 we meet at the library to host children (and adults) to visit subjects of seed gemination, pollination, and *more*! We plan to proceed down to the habitat and plant in the new seed bed there.
